Book Review

The Catholic Writer Today and Other Essays - by Dana Gioia
213 pages paperbound | Wiseblood Books | Belmont, NC 2019

“...although Roman Catholicism constitutes the largest religious and cultural group in the United States, Catholicism currently enjoys no positive presence in the American fine arts—not in literature, music, sculpture, or painting. It also marks a major historical change—an impoverishment, indeed even a disfigurement—for Catholicism, which has for two millennia played a hugely formative and inspirational role in the arts.”

So commences Dana Gioia’s essay “The Catholic Writer Today.” This essay alone is worth the price of this book if you have an interest in contemporary Catholic literature and find yourself troubled by the dearth of Catholic arts.

Where are today’s Flannery O’Connor, Graham Greene, Walker Percy, Alfred Hitchcock, Big Crosby, and JRR Tolkien? Why do Catholic writers go unpublished by the secular press and Catholicism itself is ridiculed in literary journals, visual arts, and poetry if mentioned at all?

Dana Gioia, California Poet Laureate, opera composer, Chairman of the National Endowment of the Arts, and holder of the Judge Widney Chair of Poetry at USC, explores this theme and gives a no holds barred account of failure of Catholic arts, which had nourished society with beauty, music, and entertainment for so long, but no longer.

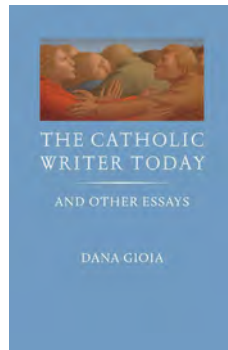
Other essays round out this collection, and we are introduced to Gerard Manley Hopkins and Dominican Brother Antoninus (William Everson, who attended Fresno State, farmed in Selma, and was a poet printer in San Francisco’s hippy era) among others.

There are also two interviews with Dana Gioia offered as exercises in the classical form of critical dialog and which provide an excellent grasp of the author’s motivations.

Two of the shorter essays in the back of this book I found equally fascinating and enlightening— “The Epistle of Paul to the Philippians” and “To Witness Truth Uncompromised: Modern Martyrs.”

I love You, dear Lord Jesus.

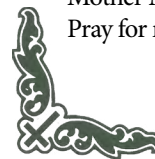
Help me to love You with all my heart.

November Speaker Recap— Patrick Coffin

November breakfast speaker, Patrick Coffin, cited a disturbing statistic from Pew Research, that for every Catholic confirmation, six leave the Church, making lapsed Catholics the largest “denomination.”

As host of Catholic Answers Live radio show for eight years and of a current podcast interviewing “crazy courageous” personalities, Patrick helps people finish the sentence “I’m Catholic because…” He urges always being ready to answer questions, to help others receive the fullness of truth, to give positive faith a second look, and to explain why one should stay in a church run by sinners.

A big myth is that the Gospel is not reachable, Patrick states. Carrying our crosses every day, one step at a time, evil can be overcome by personal sanctity. Patrick reminds us that God lives in the now, that Jesus said “I am.” With “crazy courage” one can feel apprehensive but act anyway and achieve patience by not responding to fear.

Patrick believes the Church is undergoing purification. He cites the years 1965 to 1969 as the time when “American culture fell apart.” As an example, in 1965 “The Sound of Music” won the Academy Award for best picture, but in 1969 it was “Midnight Cowboy.”

With stories, humor and a little magic, Patrick tells us that “small can be huge,” recalling that Jesus came from small beginnings but made a large impact, and so can we.

Raised in Nova Scotia, Canada, Patrick now lives in Orange County, California, with his wife, two children and a cat.
